Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

For a variety of reasons some people today claim that "the world would be better off without religion." Some look at tragic wars, such as the Thirty Years War that began between Roman Catholics and Protestants following the Reformation, and they conclude that religion in general, and Christianity in particular, is bad. Others look at how some religious leaders have misled, abused, and even killed their followers or their opponents. Still others hold resentment toward religion of any sort, due to negative personal experiences and/or deeply held atheistic beliefs. And while it must be readily admitted that there have indeed been tragedies and abuses in the name of religion, all of this is acknowledged by sincere Christians as what should not happen according to the Christian faith.

It would be wrong for someone to say that the world would be better off without love because some have loved things that are bad and have been motivated to evil actions due to misguided love. So also, right religion adhered to in the proper manner produces good, not evil, in people's lives and in the world, and therefore should not be dismissed. In communist nations, where religion was not allowed and atheism was the official belief, unspeakable injustices have been committed with incalculable murders and other atrocities done all because those in control of the government felt that they, and not God, determined what was right and what was wrong. Those who feel that the world would be better off without religion believe, in fact, that people created a concept of the divine. The biblical view, on the other hand, is that God created humanity and the entire universe, establishing an order to all things that includes morality.

Answers to the fundamental questions of human existence, that help make sense of the world, that have the most beneficial effect on society, and that provide true meaning for life, are found only in the religion of Christianity. Why are we conscious, and why is there right and wrong? What are we living for, and when did everything come to be? These foundational questions are answered adequately only from the Bible, not according to mere human philosophy.

Christians believe that the Bible was penned by people under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, communicating God's Word to humanity. In Psalm 14 the psalmist says, "The fool says in his heart, 'There is no God.'" (Psalm 14:1). The Scriptures tells us that God acknowledges that there are some who deny His existence, and will therefore dismiss religion altogether, but they are called fools. While Psalm 14:1 might sound harsh, the reality is that the existence of the Creator and moral law Giver is obvious. In his letter to the early Christians in Rome, the apostle Paul, writing about God's existence, said, "For what can be known about God is plain to them, because God has shown it to them. For his invisible attributes, namely, his eternal power and divine nature, have been clearly perceived, ever since the creation of the world, in the things that have been made. So they are without excuse" (Romans 1:19-20).

Though it is plain to people that God exists, really it is no surprise to God that many deny Him. Because humanity rebelled against God near the beginning of creation (Genesis 3), man by nature is spiritually blind, dead, and an enemy of God. People are naturally bent toward disobeying God, which can include denying Him in their thinking. Acknowledging God in one's thought life means that one should recognize that they are accountable to God for how they live morally. But denying God's existence means that one can live absolutely however one wants to, and this is the true sense in which people believe that they are better off without religion.

To willfully deny God's existence is certainly possible, and may seem liberating, but it is not easy. Martin Luther once said, "Those who do not believe that there is a god are swimming against the stream." To deny that God is real takes great effort, for a general knowledge of God is within each person.

For real life and peace, a specific and personal knowledge of the true God is what a person needs, and this is found only in God's Word to humanity, the Bible. It is in His Word that we come to know His great love for us that He demonstrated through the sacrifice of His Son, Jesus Christ, on the cross for our sins. And may we Christ followers today grow in His life-giving Word and also be ready to share that Word with an unbelieving world.
