Friends in Christ,

Can you envision standing there with the children of Israel at the Red Sea? Can you image the conflicting thoughts and feelings they experienced after witnessing the victory that was theirs following the Lord sending the tenth plague, only then to be trapped between an approaching bloodthirsty army and a sea that was (humanly speaking) impossible to cross? It appeared that God had clearly granted His people victory after the ten plagues. But then, as the Israelites left Egypt, the rage of the enemy culminated in a pursuit to seek and destroy God's people.

The children of Israel had seen God act in power for them. But now, they had been led by Moses to a place of hopelessness and despair, it would seem. They were not standing at the edge of a Red Sea bridge, that they could quickly cross and be out of the way before the Egyptian army could catch them. They were at a place that seemed like all was lost. But the Lord was not finished with His deliverance from the hand of the Egyptians. God, who is faithful and just, intervened and parted the Red Sea! And you know the rest of the story. The children of Israel walked across on dry ground, while the enemy was destroyed in the sea.

The salvation of God's people at the Red Sea is a well-known story, with a happy ending for the righteous. But as familiar as that account is, we tend to forget, in our own lives, how the Lord is in the business of rescuing those who look to Him in faith. As fallen people, we so easily forget that when faced with a seemingly impossible situation, our wonder-working saving God is by our side. And His miraculous aid is never late or insufficient, but it is right on time and supplies all our needs.

In the month of February, we begin the season of Lent. Before Christ came into the world, sin was an impossible problem. God had acted in mighty ways to save His people in the Old Testament, but the lasting guilt of mankind's trespasses remained. Yet in the fullness of time, God sent His Son, born of Mary, to redeem us. And during the season of Lent we focus in on Christ's journey to the cross to die for our sins, that we might have forgiveness full and free in Him.

God has taken care of our greatest problem in Jesus Christ, who died for our sins and rose again. We have pardon and peace with God through the shed blood of our Holy Savior. And now, in all we face, God has promised to be with us (Deuteronomy 31:6; Hebrews 13:5). Therefore, we Christians today can have confidence that our Lord will provide for all of our needs (Philippians 4:19). Truly, our gracious Heavenly Father gives us good things, not bad, as we look to Him in faith (Matthew 7:11).

Our Holy God is at work in this world for His people and through His people, who live by His Word and strive to do His will. And today, as we follow God's call by living as those SENT in this world to bring Christ's love and Word to others, shining His light, we meet resistance. Hell has an agenda, and it is to stop the advance of God's kingdom and harm God's people. But Jesus has already told us that "the gates of hell will not prevail" (Matthew 16:18).

We, members of the Church of Jesus Christ, find that time and again God provides for our needs and supplies what is necessary to do His work and carry out His will in this world. Enemies of the cross of Christ despise our efforts. They will try to silence us, and attempt to hinder us from doing God's kingdom work, in every way. The history of humanity has shown this to be true, and there is no reason to think that Satan will begin operating differently in our nation.

But God is faithful. And as we look to Jesus Christ in faith, remembering that we are to live as SENT people, God will uphold us and sustain us in carrying out His mission. So let not your hearts be troubled, but trust in Christ and bring God the glory!

The battle we wage is spiritual. And as we share the Gospel, the fruits of our labor are eternal. The devil hates us when we share Christ Jesus, but the angels in heaven rejoice over even one person who turns from sin and trusts in Him (Luke 15:10). So may the Lord bless you as you bring God's Word into the lives of those around you. Amen.
