Friends in Christ,

"April showers bring May flowers." We all know the saying, and in the month of April the Lord certainly showered down upon us His blessings! The saying is typically understood in terms of physical rain, but in my opinion it also applies to all that God blessed us with in April and the resulting "growth" we see now this month.

In April we had Holy Week and Easter Sunday. Now, in the month of May, as we continue in the Easter season, we reflect upon the Ascension of our Savior. And finally ,we have Pentecost Sunday at the end of the

month. At the beginning of May, we start with Confirmation Sunday, we celebrate God's gift of mothers on the second Sunday, and we will ask for God's blessing upon our graduating twelfth graders on the third Sunday and graduating preschool PreK4 students on the third Wednesday.

The season of Easter is a time to reflect on, and give thanks for, the new and unending resurrection life we have in Christ Jesus. And this month, with all of our special emphases, we certainly see it. We praise the Lord for His work in our lives through Word and Sacrament, the nurturing support of family, and the temporal blessings of education in particular. We remember that Christ ascended into heaven, sitting now at the right hand of the Father, ruling over all creation. And our Savior then sent to us the Holy Spirit on the day of Pentecost that we might be empowered to live faithfully as His followers in the world, bringing honor to Him daily.

In Acts chapter 2 we read, "But this is what was uttered through the prophet Joel: And in the last days it shall be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit on all flesh" (Acts 2:16-17). The fulfillment of this prophecy is found in the day of Pentecost, but it also continues today. Each time God's people gather together, as the Word of God goes forth, the Lord sends His Holy Spirit. Hearing and reading God's Word, the Holy Spirit comes upon our Confirmands and their families. The Holy Spirit blesses mothers that spend time in the Word and go to our Savior in prayer. The Holy Spirit enlivens our youth as they look in faith to Christ Jesus. And the Holy Spirit renews, guides, and uses each of us as we receive the means of grace, remembering that our ascended Savior helps us in midst of all that we face, strengthening us that we might bring honor to Him.

Jesus said in John 15, "Nevertheless, I tell you the truth: it is to your advantage that I go away, for if I do not go away, the Helper will not come to you. But if I go, I will send him to you. And when he comes, he will convict the world concerning sin and righteousness and judgment: concerning sin, because they do not believe in me; concerning righteousness, because I go to the Father, and you will see me no longer; concerning judgment, because the ruler of this world is judged. I still have many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now. When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth" (John 15:7-13).

Christ our Risen Savior has gone into heaven. He will come back again one day, but now at this time He has sent the Holy Spirit to guide us in all truth. And our Savior declared in John 14, *"I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Helper, to be with you forever, even the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot receive, because it neither sees him nor knows him. You know him, for he dwells with you and will be in you"* (John 14:16-17). So praise God that, incredibly, the Holy Spirit actually dwells within us who trust in Jesus Christ for salvation, believing that He died on the cross for our sins to bring us forgiveness and rose from the dead. 






"Because I Love You" is a story written for children ages 5-9. A loving man

125th Anniversary

October 8, 2023

School Days, School Days

"Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God, the LORD is one. You shall love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all vour might. And these words that I command you today shall be on your heart. You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise." Deuteronomy 6:4-7

Reading, 'riting, and 'rithmatic. And catechism and Bible. Since its organization, the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod has always put an emphasis on educating their children, which is why so many LC-MS congregations have preschools, grammar schools, middle schools, and high schools and is the 2nd largest school system in the world today. St. Paul's congregation was no exception.

The twenty-five Charter Members who organized St. Paul's on October 9, 1898, also placed a high priority on the education of their children. Shortly after they organized, the congregation started a Sunday School. In 1947 the first Vacation Bible School was held. Both of these schools continue to this day.

Three months after its organizational meeting, on January 29, 1899, the congregation approved the opening of a parochial day school and directed the Text Book Committee, which served as the School Board, to purchase textbooks for the school. The Bible History and the Catechetical texts were to be in the German language, and the books for the three R's were to be in English.

Tuition for members of St. Paul's was \$.25 per month, and nonmembers of the congregation were asked to pay \$.75 per month.

Pastor William Hussmann, St. Paul's first pastor, served as the principal and teacher of this one-room school. The small school grew very quickly in those early years, so that by the end of 1900, with so many non-members enrolled, the school was as large as the membership roll of the congregation.

At the July 14, 1901 Voters Meeting, the Text Book Committee presented a plan for St. Paul's to build a school of its own. The men of the church agreed to build a school with the building being twenty feet wide and thirty feet long. The dedication of their school building occurred on September 29, 1901.

In the years the school was in operation, St. Paul's experienced four changes in pastors. Attendance at the school varied depending upon the support of the pastors. In a letter written in 1965 for the church's 75th Anniversary, Rev. Hans Reuter (1908-1911), mentions that he taught at St. Paul's parochial school while he was pastor. At that time the school had 15-20 students. The parochial day school closed twenty years after its founding.

At the beginning of the 1957-1958 school year, St. Paul's opened a kindergarten. Mrs. Annie Laurie Seagle was its teacher. Mrs. Seagle was originally from North Carolina and attended Lenoir Rhyne College. Before coming to Decatur, she taught in a Lutheran school. After her husband died, Mrs. Seagle and her son, Max, moved to Decatur to be close to her daughter and son-in-law. Max Seagle says that his mother loved the children and teaching.

The kindergarten was held in the basement of the Sherman Street church and was open to members of the congregation and the community at large. There were 15 children in the class. Rhonda Reece remembers sitting on long wooden benches and memorizing the 23rd Psalm.

One of Mrs. Seagal's experiences with her class happened when she was taking the children on a walk and they happened across a utility worker. The man had dug a hole next to the telephone pole and was standing in the bottom of the hole. The children, being curious, naturally had to stop and see what was going on. The man looked up at the children and then at Mrs. Seagle and told her, "I wouldn't have your job for anything in the world." Mrs. Seagle found his sentiment amusing.

Rhonda Reece remembers playing on the monkey bars at recess and all of the children enthusiastically waving to the Army men (National Guard) across the street and being delighted when the men waved back. The kindergarten closed at the end of 1963-1964 school year.

In the fall of 1991, St. Paul's opened a Mother's Morning Out Program. After four years, in 1995, the program was expanded into a preschool incorporating a Christ-centered educational curriculum. The Mission of St. Paul's Lutheran Preschool with Extended Care is to provide a quality early childhood education program guided by Christian philosophy and doctrine and acts as a mission outreach of this congregation to community.

Classes were originally held in the east wing of the campus, but were moved into a new education wing upon the completion of a Christian Life Center in the fall of 2000. In 2008, the Preschool began the rigorous national accrediting process of National Lutheran School Accreditation (NLSA). The St. Paul's Lutheran Preschool was awarded accreditation on July 31, 2009 with continuing accreditation granted in 2019.

In the winter of 2012, recognizing a need for continued care before and after Preschool hours and on Fridays. Extended Care was offered for students needing that care. Currently the Preschool has a total of 73 students in the following classes: Toddler Class - 10, 2 year old Class - 21, 3 year old Class – 20, and PreK-4 year old Class – 22.

Deuteronomy 6:4-7 tells us that we are to teach our children so that they may know the Lord. St. Paul's has been faithful to that mission for all of its 125 years.
