Friends in Christ.

Today, people need hope. Some say we currently live in a "hopeless" society. There are few people with positive expectations right now. After all, we hear bad news constantly, and we are told by some to expect things to get worse. Many have come to the realization that our world, including our own personal lives, are (from a secular perspective) not getting any better. Therefore, despair, rather than

But, God calls us to a sure hope. And the hope that God gives is more than wishful thinking. We often use the word hope to mean "maybe" or "there is a fair chance that it will take place," or "if we are lucky." But Christian hope is not based on the weather or on circumstance, like saying "I sure hope it doesn't rain on our picnic." And neither is it based on chance.

Also, true and lasting hope cannot be based on anything that we can accomplish, for on our own we humans "fall short of the glory of God" (Romans 3:23) and we deserve God's wrath and punishment,

because of our sin. Thankfully, however, as Christ followers, the hope that our lives are based on is founded on our eternal triune God—the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit—who has promised us grace and blessing in every need, "that we through patience and comfort of the scriptures might have hope" (Romans 15:4). And the hope that we have is eternal, for we read in Romans 5:2, "We rejoice in the hope of the glory of God".

We Christians live with eternity in view, and our true hope will never be completely realized here on this earth. Yet, because Jesus Christ died for our sins and rose for us, the crown of glory will indeed be ours. Our sure hope in life eternal comes through our connection to Christ and gives us a great anticipation in sharing in glory with our loving God.

Yes, life now in this world often seems hopeless. And St. Paul says in Romans 5:3 that "we also rejoice in our sufferings." For suffering is supposed to produce in us perseverance and character and hope (Romans 5:4). But indeed often it seems and feels that the opposite happens.

Paul knew what it was like to suffer. He experienced sickness, beatings, stoning, shipwrecks, and a host of other terrible things. The people in Rome to whom Paul was writing in his epistle, also knew about hardships. Living conditions in the city of Rome were not good, especially for those who professed to be Christians. The Roman Emperor Nero persecuted Christians in a vicious manner.

Today, circumstances pull us down. As we look around we soon realize that even those of us with the most positive outlook on life can become consumed with the problems around us. We consider world events, and we become fearful. And in our own local area with the prices of necessities going up and up, many are struggling.

Also, people we know well can have an impact on us. It is sad when those around us let us down. We think and hope that we can count on them. But people are fickle. They can't always be trusted. So human sin erodes our confidence and hope.

Plus, the sin within us pulls us down. And in the end, it is our own sin which causes us to lose sight of the hope God gives to us. Instead of placing our faith and confidence in the Lord, we often depend merely on our own strength to pull us through.

But, by God's grace, as the Lord works in our hearts and minds by His Word, we hear and believe our Lord's promises (Romans 10:17). Our triune God is truly the God in whom we have hope (Romans 5:2). He gives us hope as a gift, and He will not disappoint us! The Spirit of God says that we can trust Him now, in the midst of all that we face, and we can trust our Savior forever, for Jesus lives and reigns eternally (John 14:1; Revelation 11:15). God has poured out His love for you in Christ, and you are His (Romans 5:5).






