

Friends in Christ,

At the end of August, and now into September, at St. Pau's we are spending time in worship focusing on the book of Ephesians with our sermon series titled: *If I Am In Christ*.

Sunday, August 25th – Life In Christ (Ephesians 1:1-14)

Sunday, September 1st – Grateful For Grace (Eph 2:1-10)

Sunday, September 8th – One Body (Eph 4:1-13)

Sunday, September 15th – The Armor Of God (Eph 6:10-17)

As sinners living in a fallen world, people are constantly searching for their true identities. We look for it in our careers, our relationships, and our achievements. The problem is that it will never be found there. It is only when we are found in Christ that we begin to live in God's design for our lives.

As I mentioned in last month's newsletter, on the first Sunday of this new series we will reflect on how God created and designed us to be recipients of many spiritual blessings. The second week of our series on Ephesians we will consider how we are God's handiwork, created in order to do good works that He planned for us to take part in.

For the third week of our series we are going to consider how we are one body in Christ. The fullness of Christ is best represented by the unity of the Christian body of members working in tandem with one another. By design, God has given each of us different gifts and talents to be a blessing to the world. Our job is to live out our unique calling to the best of our ability. And fixing our eyes on Jesus, we can be found faithful.

For the fourth and final week we will focus on the Armor of God. Though we live in a world full of temptation and brokenness, God has given us special armor to equip us for the journey. In Christ, we are given all the tools that are required to fight battles that are not against flesh and blood, but against evil forces at work all around us (Ephesians 6:12).

To name just one, St. Paul write that we are to put on the breastplate of righteousness (Ephesians 6:14). A warrior did not want to go into battle without a breastplate. This piece of armor was a crucial addition to any warrior's gear. The breastplate was worn over the torso, and it was made from leather, bronze, or iron. More than likely, as Paul wrote this, he would have had the Roman military in mind as foot soldiers wore a metal cover in preparation for battle. And the reason this piece of armor was so crucial was because it protected the most vital organs from being harmed, especially the heart.

Though in a physical sense protecting the heart from injury is very important, from a Jewish perspective, the heart was much more than an organ that pumped blood to the extremities. When the readers of Paul's letter to the Ephesians originally thought about the breastplate protecting the heart, they believed the heart of every person was where all thoughts, words, actions, and desires originated. The heart was the essence of who they were. Physically, without a heart beating, we are dead. Spiritually, without a protected heart, we cannot hope to survive either.

So join us, and encourage others you know to attend as well, that together our hearts might be guarded by God's grace through His Word (Proverbs 4:23). And by the Holy Spirit, may we live the lives God intended for each of us who are in Christ Jesus (Ephesians 1:1).




