Beloved in the Lord,

Grace, mercy and peace to you from God the Father, and from our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Amen.

The month of March this year is clearly all about the person and work of Jesus. In March, we continue during our mid-week worship services focusing on the Passion according to St. John. At the end of this month we have Holy Week, with Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, and Good Friday. On the very last day of this month we then celebrate the resurrection of our Lord on Easter Sunday. So, truly, as far as the worship life of the Church is concerned, March is entirely about the death and resurrection of Christ. Therefore, let us take a moment as we begin this month, to reflect briefly on the incredible significance of this for each of our lives, as well as our response to God's great grace.

We read in Romans chapter 8, verse 32, "[If God] *did not spare His own Son, but delivered Him up* [gave Him up] *for us all, how shall He not with Him also freely give us all things?*" St. Paul's argument here is from the greater to the lesser. If God would give the greatest gift He could possibly give, the gift of His Son, would He withhold the lesser things in life, the wrappings and string? The answer is obvious: of course not! The giving of His Son into death so that sinners like us could live is a gift so extraordinary that words cannot do justice to it.

On the cross, Christ would soak up like a sponge all the wickedness, iniquity, brokenness, and pain of the entire world and go to death with it. Then, having dealt with it, He would come back alive! All the work is finished! "And through him to reconcile to himself all things, whether things on earth or things in heaven, by making peace through his blood, shed on the cross" (Colossians 1:20).

When faith grabs hold of this truth, you then are truly unbeatable, unconquerable. Jesus Himself said, *"In the world you will have tribulation; but be of good cheer, I have overcome the world"* (John 16:33). And so have you in Him. In Christ you are a new creation, born again. In your Baptism you were given a new mind, new thinking, and a new disposition. Now you are able to get outside yourself to look upward toward God and love Him. Who wouldn't love a God who has done for you what He has done? And you can look outward in love toward your neighbor. You can now use your gifts, talents and abilities in loving service to Him. You can now begin to be joyfully obedient to words like these: *"I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that you present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable to God, which is your reasonable service"* (Romans 12:1). Who wouldn't want to love and faithfully serve a God who has done what He has done for us?

That God's heart is one of eternal love and service is attested to by the words of Christ in Luke chapter 12: "Blessed are those servants whom the master, when he comes, will find watching. Assuredly, I say to you that he will gird himself and have them sit down to eat, and will come and serve them" (Luke 12:37). Serving His people in this way is God's nature. And may He give us the grace to live lives worthy of His love and service. May He continually empower us to be more and more like Himself, giving and serving in love.

St. Paul's Lutheran Decatur is a Community

We are family here at St. Paul's Lutheran Decatur. Recently the Elders studied a report about why people leave the church (or don't join the church). The report said one of the main reasons for "abandoning" the church is that people don't feel like they belong or are wanted. They feel lonely and isolated.

But the church is designed by God to be a community. St. Paul says believers make up "one body." A body needs all its parts. St. Peter says we are like a wall of "living" stones. A wall missing a few stones is obvious. And we have a good community here that cares. The Elders are working on ways to build our community better and stronger and include more and more people. Here are a few ways to begin with.

Pray for others. If you take St. Paul's Member Directory and add just 7 families to your daily prayers, you will pray for the entire congregation each month. And you don't even have to know the people—God does. Ask Him to bless them and heal them and strengthen them.

If some haven't been around for a bit, call them and ask if they are alright and if they need anything.

Send out "Thinking of you, praying for you" note cards to people you know.

"Dawdle" after church. Dawdle is a technical term that means, "Hang around after church". But don't always hang out with just your closest friends. Look around and say, "Hey," and nod to others. More ideas will be coming in future monthly newsletters.


















This month is all about Easter


