Friends in Christ,

Four hundred years ago our pilgrim forefathers came to our nation's shores. And many bowed their knee to God, but some did not. Many wanted this country founded on Christian principles, though some did not.

Almost two-hundred and fifty years ago when The Declaration of Independence was written, it was a revolutionary document, in more than one way. Not only did it declare that we were separate from England, but it was an idealistic document, for it spoke of all people being created equal, and of each having certain inalienable human rights.

Congress adopted The Declaration that a new nation might find greatness in the world. Then they strove to take the idealism of The Declaration of Independence and put it into reality, and that was not so easy.

Once during a deadlock, tradition says that Benjamin Franklin stood and said, "Gentlemen, let us pause and pray. Let us call upon the Almighty God and ask for His help." They did that, and continued to pray, and the delegates brought forth a Constitution truly glorious in purpose, in freedom, and in hope for all people. And we give thanks for what God accomplished through His people two and a half centuries ago, and we remember all those since who have given their lives to preserve the freedoms we cherish.

Though today, in our time, we also recognize that America is really two nations in one. It is, in a sense, a nation within a nation. One is spiritual, wanting to live by the commandments and principles of God. The other is sensual, sex-oriented, materialistic, violent, wanting to live by force, by its own cunning and skill.

Since the beginning, there has been a spiritual and moral voice in our nation. The Church (that is the *true* Church, committed to the infallible Word of God) has spoken the Lord's Word to our leaders and throughout society to all people of our land. But I am aware that we as Christians, members of Christ's Church, don't always do the right thing; we are not always as involved as God expects us to be.

And indeed, God is dealing with our nation. We may even ask, or consider, "How near is God to removing His hand of favor from our country?" Truly, the people of our land must turn from their blatant sins and look in faith to Christ who died to bring us forgiveness. Risen from the dead, Jesus is our only Hope.

There is a spiritual move in our nation today. It may not be big enough to be called a "revival" in our land, but God is stirring the hearts of people. So the real question is, are we praying that we would be a part of it? Are we praying that God would use us during these uncertain times to reach others and point them to Christ?

Can a nation come back to God? The answer, of course, is yes. As long as there's a God, people can come back to Him. All one needs to do is repent—that is, turn from sin and look in faith to Jesus Christ who died for our sins and rose from the grave.

So at this time, as a fellow member of Christ's Church, please pray with me:

"Heavenly Father, we come to you in the Name of Your Son, Jesus Christ,

whose we are and whom we are called to serve. Lord, we love our nation.

We pray that the Spirit of God would stir up the consciences and the hearts of our people.

Lord, let spiritual awakening come to our land. Rouse sleeping people. Enter hearts by Your Word.

Use us each to share the Word of Christ. Grant newness of life, and faith that is vibrant.

Let the lost look to Christ for salvation, and let the lapsing live with firm commitment to You.

In Jesus Name we pray. Amen."



A Welcome Break for Traveling Volunteers St Paul's Bed and Breakfast Ministry

Following the devastating Category 5 hurricane that ravaged the New Orleans area in August of 2005, St Paul's embarked on one of its largest undertakings in its 125 years of existence. This effort was directed at helping residents of New Orleans affected by this terrible storm. Several volunteer work groups from St Paul's made the journey to New Orleans 9th Ward. The groups included both adults and youth. The volunteer's work included clearing storm debris and stripping contaminated wood from flooded homes. Prayer sessions with the hurricane victims were also a huge part of this mission. In addition to the volunteer work groups that traveled to New Orleans, St Paul's members also participated in the effort by collecting food, water and supplies that were transported to Camp Restore, the Lutheran hurricane relief headquarters located in New Orleans. It was a fantastic effort by all the St Paul's members.

Our largest group was from Asland University. Because they were a youth group of 35, our church decided to feed them a big breakfast that included casseroles and bacon. Their comment was they couldn't believe someone would do all of this for them. Another youth group stayed for 8:30 service Sunday morning and sang for worshippers.

All the groups have shown respect for our facilities and have appreciated the hospitality.

Lutheran Churches from many Northern states were also sending groups to help. Our church members were touched by the willingness of fellow Christians who, though they lived so far away, were willing to take time from work, school and responsibilities to make the long journey to serve their fellow man. Jane Burrell, one of our church members, suggested that we set up a Bed and Breakfast ministry to help offset the expenses incurred by these distant traveling groups. The B & B ministry would serve as a mid-way overnight stop for the work teams traveling from Northern churches to the New Orleans area.

Teams were assembled to facilitate the work necessary to run the Bed and Breakfast ministry. These teams included: Greeter Team, Set-Up Team, Breakfast Team, Clean Up Team and Laundry Team. The Bed & Breakfast Ministry team members had to work closely with the other groups using the church facilities such as our Preschool and Boys and Girls Club to ensure the safety and security of all involved. This required much coordination, special arrangements and new procedures.

The Bed & Breakfast Ministry operated for approximately two years providing an overnight stay, hot shower and breakfast for many volunteer work groups, both for the trip to New Orleans and for the return trip home. When the relief effort in New Orleans ended, the B & B Ministry transitioned to provide lodging and meals for the Bike & Build organization. This organization coordinates college age volunteers that travel cross country from the East Coast to the West Coast via bicycle to raise funds and awareness for the Habitat for Humanity Charity. The young people from Bike & Build utilized the B & B Ministry for approximately ten years. They were not only an inspiration for our members, but also a pleasure to host. In addition to raising funds for the charity, the volunteers would also participate in the construction of habitat homes in the area. They were also kind enough to host bike safety workshops for our Boys and Girls Club members.

The Bed & Breakfast Ministry was much needed, much appreciated and hugely successful. The ministry provided housing and meals for almost 1,000 volunteers traveling to the coast or cross country. It was a great effort by the members of St Paul's and was most certainly a blessing to not only the travelers it served, but also for our team members.


