Friends in Christ,

The month of October is going to be an exciting one. There are so many special things happening at St. Paul's this month that it makes one proud (in a God honoring way) to be a Lutheran in the South! Though we live in predominately Baptist country, and dearly love these brothers and sisters in Christ, this month we celebrate our wonderful Lutheran heritage in a multifaceted way. For truly, Lutherans began the original "back to the Bible" movement with the Protestant Reformation started by Dr. Martin Luther, and in October we celebrate especially all that God has done in our lives through His Holy Word.

The month begins with the start of the Children's Christmas Program practices (hard to believe it's already time to prepare!) on Wednesday, October 2nd, with Skylar leading this effort. Saturday, October 5th, Reverend Gary Nagy will conduct a tour of St. Paul's stained glass windows at three different times (9 AM, 11 AM, and 1 PM). Sunday, October 6th we will have one service in the Sanctuary, starting at 10:45 AM, that will be a Narrative Service explaining the different parts of the Lutheran liturgy as a concluding worship service for the celebration of the 125 years that the Lord has blessed St. Paul's Lutheran Church with life in Christ and ministry to one another and our community. And following worship, the Lutheran Women's Missionary League (LWML) will host a scrumptious Bratwurst dinner that you won't want to miss as well.

Then, on Sunday, October 13th we have the Blessing of the Quilts at the early service, an encouraging and always important congregational Voters Meeting during the Sunday School hour, and we begin the special "Then Sings My Soul (Psalm 71:23)" sermon series as we focus on the emphasis of well-known hymns over three Sundays, as follows:

Sunday, October 13th – Rock of Ages (Hebrews 13:8)

Sunday, October 20th – Just as I Am (Luke 15:20)

Sunday, October 27th – A Mighty Fortress Is Our God (Psalm 46:11)

On Reformation Sunday, along with focusing on the emphasis of Luther's famous hymn, we will praise God for, and rejoice in, the main emphases of the Reformation and the work of Martin Luther. Two of the greatest accomplishments of Martin Luther for the Church were undoubtedly the translation of the Bible, so that God might speak directly to the people, and the introduction of an order of service with hymns in the vernacular, so that people at worship might speak directly to God.

In connection with the continual ministry and outreach efforts of St. Paul's Lutheran Preschool, and Kidz, Tweenz, and Teens Enrichment (KTT), St. Paul's will host the always joyful "Trunk Or Treat" event on Wednesday, October 30th starting at 5:30 PM, where preschool and KTT families, as well as others in our community, typically attend in good numbers.

All of what I have mentioned here are the special activities for this month, and as you know there are so very many ongoing ministry activities that take place here at St. Paul's as well that make our congregation such a wonderful place to call our church home.

So, truly, in the month of October especially, isn't it great being a Lutheran Christian! Hasn't the Lord incredibly blessed us over 125 years and still today! Yes indeed, praise God from whom all blessings flow.

From the Library: "It's a small world in the Missouri Synod Story."

One book given to the St. Paul's Church Library from the Hornish Family Library in memory of Beth and to the glory of God was "Pastor Epistles" by Mark Love. Turns out Mark Love is a pastor at Trinity Lutheran, Toledo, OH. One of our families here has relatives who go to that church, so while they were visiting in Ohio they went to that church and got Pastor Love to autograph our copy of the book. It reads; 'To the Saints of St. Paul's—All God's Blessing, Rev. Mark W. Love." Check the book out in the new arrivals section on the library desk.



People who live in a community usually live by a certain code. In some historical neighborhoods, for example, there are guidelines for renovating their homes in keeping with the style and period of the neighborhood. In another example, some neighbors have taken it upon themselves to not use fireworks because one of their neighbors suffers from Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD).

St. Paul's has a code of living. We are not forced to follow it, however. It is a code that flows from our love for others. Our love is rooted and grounded in Jesus' love for us—dying on the cross to take away sin and rising on the third day in victory.

St. Paul wrote of this code in his epistle to Titus: Be submissive to rulers and authorities, be obedient, be ready for every good work, speak evil of no one, avoid quarreling, be gentle, and show perfect courtesy toward all people (3:1-2).





CELEBRATING October 8, 2023 CrossLife Contemporary Worship Enters Its 21st Year

Before his retirement, Pastor Reinhardt had expressed the need to add a service that was less formal for those members who were hesitant to attend services in the Sanctuary. In 2000 the ARC was built to the glory of God to be used in ministry to the community. So, in 2003, Pastor Dave Lewis and several St. Paul's members attended a weekend workshop entitled Natural Church Development (NCD). Out of this workshop and the Long-Range Planning Committee's goal to establish a third alternative worship service to be held in the ARC, Pastor Dave Lewis and Pastor Kevin Kieschnick asked Bill Klein to coordinate the third worship service. He was to design a worship service using contemporary Christian music along with elements of liturgical worship with confession/absolution, communion, scripture reading, creeds, responsive readings, etc. The service was named CrossLife based on John 5:24.

A worship team, *Audience of One*, was formed, and they led the first contemporary worship service in the ARC on the first Sunday in November 2003. Attendance was 25-30 (including the 7-member band). Band members included Bill and Cathy Klein, Joey and Paige Cantrell, Karen Gaertner, Pauline Maas, Paula Brown, and in 2004, Jane Burrell, and A/V support was given by Rick Morgan and Jeff Morgan. Saturday setup took 3-4 hours to run audio and visual equipment across the gym and to set up a platform, video screen, and chairs for the worshippers. The love of the Lord instilled enthusiasm!



From 2003 through the pastoral vacancy in 2005-2006, growth was slow but continuous, and the attendance averaged 40-50 worshipers. With the calling of Pastor Eddie Scheler as our pastor in 2006 brought our first keyboardist to the worship band, Tricia Scheler. In the summer of 2007, the first ARC renovation project took place that included a larger platform/altar area, a wall-mounted projector, a permanent screen, storage closets, an altar area with carpeting, and additional partitions for enclosure and sound dampening, after all, it is a gym!

All funds were raised outside of budget on a pay-as-yougo basis. Jerry Alldredge and Rick Morgan designed and constructed from wood the platform, the lectern, baptismal fount, cabinetry, and the altar so that all could be stowed away during the week. Rebecca Mitchell designed the ceiling banners and sound platforms to reflect the contemporary setting, and worship band members made and installed them as well as painted the dark navy background behind the platform. Audrey Hamm organized setup teams for chairs and tables that still needed to be put in place and taken down each Sunday for gym activities during the week. This project reduced setup time to 2 hours and greatly enhanced the worship experience. In 2013 Paul Colba aided in the addition of a walk-draw curtain to encircle the worship platform during the week, and he and Bill Klein constructed a permanent sound booth which greatly reduced the weekly setup to only chairs and tables.

To the glory of our gracious God, under Bill Klein's gifted worship leadership and the dedication of Audience of One, this worship ministry blessed scores of families and individuals in worship and praise to our Savior. CrossLife went into the community for worship on occasion including Rhodes Ferry Park on the river and at Point Mallard Park. There was continued growth in CrossLife attendance averaging 79-111 from 2007-2012, matching the average attendance for 8:15 and 10:45 worship in the Sanctuary, truly serving as a 3rd worship service for the congregation. Other band members were added as others left to include Andrew Poe, Christen Bradley, Paul Colba, and Selena Salgado, A/V techs included Jacob Cantrell and Jacob Morgan, as well as others who also served in Audience of One and those who continue to serve behind the scenes. Jane Burrell continues to ensure a worshipful setting with décor.

After Bill Klein retired from leading worship, newlycalled Pastor Kretzschmar felt it vital to continue the CrossLife worship ministry and became its new worship leader, guitarist, and vocalist. Christen Bradley remained as drummer and Steve O'Shea joined the worship band on guitar; several students from Oakwood College as well as Laura Frasher Tuttle and Mark Blaske have served as keyboardists. Nikki, Kody, and Ty Asher facilitated setup and takedown from 2018-2024. During the pandemic in 2020-2021, Pastor and the band determinedly led the continuance of worship during our drive-in service aided by the elders and Currently, Tim Herfurth and James other volunteers. Gilchrist arrange for rotating volunteers for A/V and host family serving opportunities, and the elders oversee the setup.

CrossLife worship hosts the Children's Christmas program, and Preschool Graduations, Thanksgiving and Christmas programs, and Afterschool KTT and previous Boys & Girls Club programs, Vacation Bible School, and even Voters meetings and special church-wide gatherings have utilized the stage and A/V. To God be the Glory!

29 January 1899	W. O Hussman installed as first resident pastor of St. Paul's.
6 November 1900	Building committee of St. Paul's Church established.
6 January 1901	Building purchase committee established.
24 March 1901	Dedication of the congregation's first church building on Sherman Street.
14 July 1901	Plan to build a school for St. Paul's approved.
29 September 1901	Dedication of St. Paul's school building.
6 December 1903	St. Paul's buys its first Christmas Tree.
1921	St. Paul's school closes after 20 years serving the community.
1930	St. Paul's granted membership in the LCMS.
April 1937	Ladies Aid Society changes its name to Lutheran Ladies Auxiliary.
1942	Foundation of the Lutheran Women's Missionary League (LWML).
1943	Foundation of a Men's Club.
1947	First Vacation Bible School at St. Paul's.
1948	Congregation votes to sponsor a choir.
1950	Building Committee hires architect to design remodel of the Sherman Street Church.
1951	St. Paul's building is turned on its foundation and remodeled.
1957	St. Paul's starts a kindergarten.
25 June 1961	Arrival of Pastor Ronald Reinhardt.
1961	St. Paul's congregation votes to have two Sundy morning services.
January 1962	Church expansion committee formed.
12 April 1964	Church expansion committee reactivated.
1964	St. Paul's kindergarten closes.
January 1965	Formation of the Facility Needs Committee.
13 August 1967	Ground Breaking for the new church on Carridale Street.
1968 1968	St. Paul's congregation moves to Carridale Street.
1908 19 May 1968	Organization of the official Quilters Group. Dedication service for the new church.
19 May 1908 1972	Establishment of the Organ Fund.
1972 19 January 1975	Dedication of the Allen Computer Organ.
January 1988	Formation of the Expansion Committee for an education wing.
16 October 1988	Congregation approves the expansion plan.
19 February 1989	Dedication of the stained glass windows in Sanctuary.
1991	Beginning of the Mother's Morning Out program.
1995	Establishment of St. Paul's Preschool.
11 June 1998	Second expansion committee formed which will include the gym/ARC.
11 April 1999	Commissioning of Missionaries to sister church plant, Christ Our Redeemer, in Hartselle.
2000	Dedication of 2 nd second expansion, the Christian Life Center.
2 November 2003	CrossLife contemporary worship service begins.
2007	Purchase of the new organ.
31 July 2009	St. Paul's Preschool achieved National Lutheran School Accreditation
2013	Preschool Ministry incorporated Extended Care.
4 April 2018	Storm damaged Church Office wing; facilities rebuilt and modernized.
2019	Merger of LWML and Lutheran Ladies Auxiliary to form Lutheran Women in Mission (LWM).
March 2020	Pandemic restrictions opened the opportunity for live-streamed and drive-in worship services;
