Friends in Christ,

How important to you is it that our Savior is in your life? How much does it mean to you that Christ died for your sins and rose from the dead? How great have been the blessings of our Lord, spiritually, knowing that you belong to Him now on this earth, and one day you will live with Him in heaven? How has the new life that you have been given through faith in Christ made all the difference as you live amid the challenges of this fallen world? As you consider these questions, I know that for you, who are taking the time to read this newsletter, the obvious answer is that Jesus Christ means everything to you.

In August, as summer break comes to an end and a new school year starts, we will begin a four-week journey reflecting on the incredible significance of Christ in our lives. And as I emphasize in sermons that Christ is our Reconciler, our Deliverer, our Liberator, and our Illuminator, not only will you be blessed by the Word of God, but hopefully those you have brought with you or invited to church will be eternally blessed as well. Yes, that's right, this will be an opportunity for you to bring, or to lead, others to join us for worship, in-person, online or by radio, that together we may consider the astounding difference that Jesus makes.

For our worship series *Christ In My Life* below are the dates, the specific emphases, and the Scriptures passages we will focus on.

Sunday, August 20th – Christ, My Reconciler (2 Corinthians 5:19-21)

Sunday, August 27th – Christ, My Deliverer (Acts 16:25-34)

Sunday, September 3rd – *Christ, My Liberator* (John 8:31-32)

Sunday, September 10th – Christ, My Illuminator (Isaiah 60:1-7)

And I have to be honest. While I was planning to do a worship series at the start of the school year to spark interest, that individuals and families might return to worship with great commitment, I ended up scrapping my original plan. For the Lord put on my heart to do something fundamental, foundational, essential. And the more I thought about it I realized that this also meant something evangelistic, because as we approach our 125th Anniversary here at St. Paul's we recognize that the Good News of Jesus Christ is what our Christian fellowship is all about. The saving Gospel is the reason that we exist as a congregation. And Christ in our lives not only makes us, personally, who we are, but we are alive with real unending Life only because Christ is in us (John 1:4; 1 John 4:4).

But what about those around us? What about those around you? Are the people in your family, among your friends, in your neighborhood, or at your work growing in Christ who is the True Life? Is Christ really in their lives, or is He just someone that they hear and think about occasionally? Indeed, I am certain that you know people who need to hear the Good News of Christ that the Holy Spirit might work faith in their hearts, moving them then to grow in God's Word (John 1:12-14).

GOD CAN USE YOUR INVITE TO BRING ... OTHERS ... TO JESUS So will you pray with me? Will you pray for those who don't know Christ at all, or are not growing in God's Word in a Christian congregation? And then will you either bring them, or invite them, to our church? Today, there are many people who don't regularly attend any church. But it is only through the Gospel, in Word and Sacrament, that Christ comes into our lives and sustains us in Life eternal (John 6:63). For Jesus Christ is the One with the words of eternal life (John 6:68).



A Twist to the West: Old St. Paul's Gets Remodeled

"Set thee up waymarks, make thee high heaps: set thine heart toward the highway, even the way thou wentest: turn again,
O virgin of Israel, turn again to these thy cities."

Jeremiah 31, v. 21 (KJV)

When World War II ended, the Great Depression was a thing of the past. The United States, along with Decatur and Morgan County were poised for growth and prosperity. In 1940, Morgan County's population was 48,000 and by 1950 it has increased almost ten percent to 53,000. The city of Decatur's population growth was even more impressive. Its population if 1940 was 16,600 which by 1950 had grown to 20,000, an increase of 20%.

The congregation of St. Paul's was also growing during the 1940s under the leadership of its pastors: Emil Tonn, Walter Schoech, and Robert Maschke. When Pastor Maschke accepted a call to Wisconsin in 1950, he was replaced by a recent seminary graduate. The newly minted Pastor Paul Krohn accepted the call from St. Paul's and would go on to serve the church for over a decade until 1961.

By the time Pastor Krohn arrived, the church building had been in use for over fifty years. During Pastor Schoech's ministry, the congregation recognized that they needed to renovate and expand the church's facilities. So, in 1945 a building fund was established and planning began. Shortly before Pastor Krohn's arrival, the Building Committee in the spring of 1950 hired the architect Thomas Gardiner of Nashville to design the remodeled church. It had been decided to add a basement to provide recreational facilities, classrooms, and a kitchen.

The church's lot triangular shaped with Sherman Street to the north and Gordon Drive to the South with the point ending on Fourth Street when Sherman and Gordon came together. At that time the front of the church faced Sherman Street which was and remains its physical address. Since the north -south dimension of the lot was too narrow for adding a basement, that necessitated raising the church building and turning it ninety degrees to face Fourth Street and have enough room for the basement. Raising the church also meant some of the basement walls would be above ground and allowed for a walk-in door on the south side of the repositioned building.

The original main entrance to the church, however, was located on the west side of the church that faced Fourth Street. Part of the renovation involved putting the main entrance at the end of the church. So after the church was turned, its main entrance continued to face Fourth Street.

On 16 February 1951, the Building Committee signed a contract with Elton H. Reeves, a Decatur contractor. His crew arrived on 23 March to begin the process of lifting and turning the church. The congregation had one last service in the building on 25 March at which time the church was already without lighting and heating. During the time the turning and renovating took place, the congregation held services at the nearby armory. Pastor Krohn was understandably nervous about the church building being damaged during the turning. Mr. Reeves, the contractor, assured Pastor Krohn

that everything would go smoothly. In fact, he stated that if the church bell rang even once, he would give dollars fiftv Pastor Krohn. Reeves did not have to pay up. bell never The rang. The turning of the church was definitely attention getter. The Decatur Daily carried several stories about the remodeling.

The work was completed fairly quickly and services resumed in the remodeled church on 9 September 1951. The whole process took place a bit

The whole process took place a bit at the church today at 4 P.M. over five months at the cost of \$26,000.

By the way, the remodel did not include the addition of air conditioning. It was not until 1955 that the congregation established a committee to investigate the need for and the congregation's desire for air conditioning. The committee sought pledges from the congregation to pay for the improvement. Apparently, the desire was there since they were successful in securing an adequate number of pledges. A new heating and cooling system was installed during May 1957. We can assume that the attendance at services during the summer probably picked up.

St. Paul's moved to its current location on Carridale Street in 1968 and the old church has had several other groups use it as a place of worship. To this day, the old church on Sherman Street remains a lovely building with its dignified sanctuary and welcoming fellowship facilities, kitchen, and nursery in the basement. But St. Paul's continued to grow and that growth required space that was not available at Sherman Street. Look for the story of the move to Carridale Street in a future essay.
