Friends in Christ,

He was alive! On that first Easter Sunday, Christ had risen from the dead! But there was one person absent as He appeared to the disciples, Thomas. And he would seems to be a skeptic from the twenty-first century, as Thomas said "Unless I see and touch. I will not believe. No way."

Doubt comes so naturally to the human mind, doesn't it? Personally, we know just how easily doubt enters in, don't we? And as we look to God's Word, the Holy Bible, we find numerous examples of the doubt of Jesus' disciples. Mary Magdalene said in John chapter 20 verse 2: "They have taken the Lord out of the tomb." We read in John 20 verse 9, that it says of Peter and John: "They still did not understand from Scripture that Jesus had to rise from the dead." And of all the disciples, Luke chapter 24 verse 11 tells us: "They did not believe the women, because their words seemed to them like nonsense."

Doubt, immediately following Jesus' resurrection, was quite understandable, right? For Jesus was crucified. He was dead. The centurion made sure of it. Jesus was laid in a tomb-no doubt about it. And no one has ever, by his own power, risen from the grave.

Author of the well-known book On Death and Dying, Dr. Elisabeth Kubler-Ross, wrote: "Man has conquered space, he has made great technological advances, but he cannot conquer death." And that is a true enough statement, for on our own, by the power within a mere mortal individual, death is an undefeatable foe. But, because Christ in risen from the dead, we can ourselves, confident in our Savior, even stomp on the grave and say boldly with St. Paul's, as he wrote to the Corinthians, "Where, O death, is your victory?... Thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ" (1 Corinthians 15:55, 57).

Sadly, though, doubt still actively robs people today of the joy of "the resurrection of the body" that Christ won for us. It is so easy for people not to believe, and therefore miss the confidence and certain hope Christ brings. People in our culture, even many unbelievers, yet believe in the spirit world and in angels. And Luke 24 verse 37 says that when the Risen Christ physically appeared to them, the disciples themselves "were startled and frightened, thinking they saw a ghost."

But Jesus makes clear at His appearing that His body is a real, glorified, physical body when He asks the disciples to "touch me and see; a ghost does not have flesh and bones, as you see I have" (Luke 24:39). And for final proof Jesus even eats a piece of broiled fish (Luke 24:43). Obviously a spirit does not consume food. Yes, death is totally defeated with the bodily resurrection of our Lord, Jesus Christ!

In the month of April, during the seven week season of Easter, we truly celebrate that Jesus is alive! And because He lives, we know with certainty that our sins are forgiven, and we shall live.

Absolutely, we know that Christ has conquered sin, death, and the devil. And trusting in Jesus, if God is for us, who can be against us? So do not doubt, but believe God's Word and rejoice this Easter season, for Jesus our Savior is indeed alive!


defeated death for our sake.

Join us on Sunday mornings starting at 9:45 AM in the Fellowship Room for a study on the Gospel of Mark to answer such foundational questions about the








