Staffing Committee: Report in the 2015 Fall Semi-Annual Report. Craig Baker presented the team's activities and findings from their four meetings and discussions. Pastor Eddie's acceptance of the Divine Call in Texas now affects going forward to seek a senior pastor to replace him before considering a contracted or called person responsible for the youth. Immediate attention is needed in worship service evaluation since the number and times affect a guest preacher during the interim. The remaining items in the report are longer-term activities for the next 10-20 years to form a vision for our facilities and ministry to reach the unchurched. Art congratulated and thanked the committee.

New Business:

Nominations: Report in the 2015 Fall Semi-Annual Report. Jimmy Mueller presented the slate of officers and teams for 2016;. Dave Burrell was nominated for President; Jeff Pittman moved to accept; Mickey Whiteside seconded LJ Alvis was nominated for Trustee; passed.

2016 Financial Plan: Report in the 2015 Fall Semi-Annual Report. Carol Morgan presented the Plan; it was asked why an Associate Pastor was not in the Plan; Carol explained that the present income does not support one and increases would have to be realized to proceed with adding the line item to the Plan. Jimmy Mueller moved to accept the Plan; Nancy Neuendorf seconded; passed.

Call Committee Plan: Art announced that anyone interested in serving on the Call Committee should contact the Church Office as Elders/Vestry/Staffing Committee as leadership intend to move intentionally and timely in the search for a new pastor and are meeting on Wednesday, October 28 to proceed.

Pastors Report: Report in the 2015 Fall Semi-Annual Report. Pastor Eddie said that after much prayer and fasting the decision to take the Texas call would move the Schelers closer to family there. He shared his excitement over the combined services that have been held this fall and hopes there is revitalization and a more unity in the times ahead. He also explained the Divine Call process stating that anyone - the District President, the Circuit pastors, and any congregational member - may suggest a name to be added to the list to be considered for a Call. He explained that this is a time of "interim" and not "vacancy" since the Holy Spirit and the congregation is still present.

Financial Reports: Report in the 2015 Fall Semi-Annual Report. Giving was reported down by 6.3% from last year, and expenses are being held in check. Jim Forthman presented the motion to accept the report; Rich Maschke seconded; passed.

Elders Report: Report in the 2015 Fall Semi-Annual Report. John Mann highlighted combined service planning and his Delegate Report to the District Convention held this summer and that we would be calling a special voters meeting in January to nominate synod officers for the July 9-14, 2016 LCMS Convention.

Education Team: Report in the 2015 Fall Semi-Annual Report. Tricia Scheler announced that she would be staying in Decatur with Rachel and continue to serve full-time as Children's Director through VBS, a 4-day Bible School May 31 – June 3, and could go to part time after VBS. She reported on the Children's Program, First Priority at Austinville Elementary, and the Middle and High School Youth activities. Nancy Neuendorf reported on the Preschool Ministry which is full with 63 children, of which half are in extended care. Assistance is welcome for the Nov 24 Thanksgiving Feast and the December Christmas program.

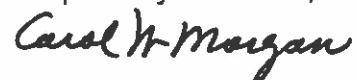
Outreach Report: Report in the 2015 Fall Semi-Annual Report. Pedro Santaliz reported that the Outreach Team was going to concentrate on in-reach solely for a while to unify the congregation. Trunk or Treat is needing trunks, volunteers, and candy.

Trustee Report: Report in the 2015 Fall Semi-Annual Report. Don Olson reported on repair items including the replacement of an HVAC unit in the Quad room area and replacement of the East Sanctuary heat exchangers; replacement of the Sacristy frig, the Office Wing and exterior doors painted, and money in the 2016 Financial Plan of \$10k for HVAC maintenance, \$6K towards resealing and restriping the parking lot, and plans for red tip replacement.

Everyone was thanked that helped this year; the Assembly was encouraged to contact anyone in leadership or the Church Office with ideas or to volunteer as we embrace the interim with enthusiasm and renewal.

Pastor Eddie led a closing prayer as we adjourned.

Discussion followed with confirmation that both the present loan and the new loan did not contain prepayment penalties. The vote to accept the Resolution passed with 30 members voting in the affirmative and 0 voting to the negative. The meeting was adjourned at 9:30 a.m.

Education Team Report - May 1, 2016

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Preschool

- St. Paul's Preschool with Extended Care has ministered to 65 children this year.
- 7 teachers, 2 classroom aides, and 6 Extended Care workers are on staff.
- 2 children are currently on full scholarship and 3 children receive partial scholarships. Thank you to those who have donated to our scholarship fund.
- Continued DHR exemption status has been granted until March 8, 2017. All parents sign a notarized statement saying they are made aware of our DHR exempt status based on not having a hot lunch program. All information related to our exemption, including fire inspection, health department letter, and notarized statements are in the Preschool office.
- Parent surveys will be sent out the week of May 2nd. We have added an interest survey to determine if/when parents would like to have special classes, etc.... The results will be used to look at programming for next year.
- End of year assessments will be completed by May 16th in order to set up conferences with parents.
- 2015-2016 Cumulative Annual Report/School Improvement Plan is finished and will be sent to Donna Behnken.
- The Trustees have completed or are working on several projects recommended by the NLSA visiting team.
- Any long range planning for expansion of the Preschool will be done after our new Pastor is called. Right now there are no funds available for any physical expansion.
- Preschool Graduation is Wed., May 18th at 6:30 in the Sanctuary. Fun Day is Thursday, May 24th. We need a few volunteers to help with our reception and game day. If you are interested please call 256-353-1353.

Children

First Priority Kids

- April is the last month for the 2015-2016 school year.
- We have averaged 57 kids in the last 3 months.
- There were six volunteers from St. Paul's who helped with the Austinville Elementary FP Club; we encourage everyone to consider helping in some capacity in bringing the gospel and prayer to our city's elementary schools of which all are participating for the 2016-2017 school year.

Winshape Camp:

- The camp will take place June 27 – July 1.
- The cost is \$204. There are ample opportunities to earn scholarships.
- There will be another Spirit Day/Night at Chick-fil-a on May 16.
- We will need help with the Winshape worker dinners each evening of camp, June 27 – June 30.

VBS

- May 31 – June 3 9:00am – 12:00pm
- Extended child care from 12 – 5:00pm for \$25 (for 4 days) per child since B&G Club will not yet be open.
- The Volunteer Orientation and Appreciation Lunch will be May 22 at noon in the Fellowship Room.

Boys & Girls Club

- Afterschool program enrollment is at 60.
- Summer enrollment continues of which 38 children are signed up.
- God's Place Youth Chapel on Fridays is going extremely well, with approximately 38 children and adults in attendance each week.
- Summer Bible classes for 3 age groups need leaders.

Youth

- Over 30 of St. Paul's Middle School youth attended the Southern District Jr High Gathering Retreat last October.
- Seven 8th graders completed the Confirmation Oral Exam on April 22 and were confirmed on April 24.
- Six Middle and High School youth participated in Discipleship Now in February.
- High School Youth and the Elders hosted the Easter Breakfast and the youth decorated the cross for Easter.
- The Annual Dinner Auction was held on April 23.
- 12 High School Youth and 4 mentors are registered to attend the National Youth Gathering in New Orleans in July.
- Bible studies in preparation for the National Youth Gathering will be held.
- Summer plans will be for made for youth Wednesday fellowship nights.
